Introduction

This report we are presenting to you focuses on the main activities that were carried out in the month of November, 2022.

Monitoring of projects

In order for us to ascertain the progress of the organization, we had to move and check on most of the beneficiaries' projects and we came up with the following observations;

We noticed co-operation and spirit of togetherness among the beneficiaries. They stand with one another in time of need by providing emotional, material and financial support. They pool resources and give to a member to buy something valuable like land, animals (cows,goats,pigs). For example Nakami Salika from Nabikhoso "A" work with a goal development Ass. Bought iron sheets which they are going to use to roof their house.

Improving standards of living among some of our consistent and hardworking members was also observed. Some of the businesses are thriving. For instance; Nandutu Sarah from Mausi Rula and work development group who deals in tailoring confessed that she bought a dairy cow from PAUTHO loans and she is very proud.

Good reports from our members has created a lot of awareness among the community and this has prompted many other new groups to show interest and be considered by our organization. Hence good reputation for us as an organization

We encouraged vulnerable women to engage themselves in Income Generating Activities (IGA) and surely almost every beneficiary is working hard to make ends meet. They are engaged in various business activities as listed in previous reports.

In the trainings, we encouraged the women to maintain hygiene and sanitation in order to avoid certain diseases that can be caused.

Loan Recoveries

With great humility, we report to the team that the beneficiaries complied by remitting their soft loans as agreed. We were also able to recover almost all the money from Kwaya women group of which they seemed to have defaulted. We also took action by involving Police and filed a court case against Mukhwana Anthony for failing to pay back the loan he took in 2020. The court is yet to set the dates for hearing.

Loan Disbursement

In November, we mobilized and trained new groups from the sub counties of Nyondo and Nabumali Town council. We are here to inform the team that some amount of money was disbursed to individuals (staff Kwa Moyo) and groups both new and old such as; Nyondo Tubana women group, Nyondo rambila atwela women group, Nyondo Ambanilakho women group, Buwangwiri women farmers association group and among others.
